
A Tribute to English Class







Star of Bethlehem

We all are familiar with the name Jesus. He was the "King of Jews", a messiah. He is said to have mystical powers and help people in need. After his birth, a star guided the "MAGI" to him. Because of this star, the Magi knew that Jesus was born, and later helped them go to Bethlehem. According to the Gospel of Matthew, the star made the magi travel to Jerusalem. There they met King Herod of Judea, and asked where the king of the Jews had been born. Herod's advisors said that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, a nearby village, because of a prophecy in the Book of Micah. While the magi were going to Bethlehem, they saw the star again. The star stopped above the place where Jesus was born. There, the magi saw Jesus with his mother, worshipped him and gave costly presents to him. They then returned back to their kingdoms. The Three Kings were among the wisest men of their time. Discovering that the Messiah was to be born, they organized an expedition to find him, following a star that led them to Bethlehem. Despite their culture and religion in a foreign land, they accepted Jesus as their Savior.

Christians usually think of the star as a miraculous sign to show the birth of the Christ.

Astronomers have thought of many different explanations for the star. A nova, a planet, a comet, an occultation, and a conjunction (planets coming together) have all been suggested. Some scholars say that the story is not historically right and that the star was not real. The Bible seems to suggest that the magi visited Jesus at least several months after he was born. The visit is usually celebrated on Epiphany (January 6) in Western Christianity and on Christmas (December 25) in Eastern Christianity.

Don't you think that a doubt remains? How is Jesus' birth related to star of Bethlehem? Well, that's a really good question! The Star of Bethlehem, also called the Christmas Star, is a star in the Bible and Christian tradition. The Star of Bethlehem is traditionally linked to the Star Prophecy in the Book of Numbers:

I see him, but not now;
I behold him, but not near;
A Star shall come out of Jacob;
A Scepter shall rise out of Israel,
And batter the brow of Moab,
And destroy all the sons of tumult.

This prophecy refers to a man, who will end the sorrows of people and the people think thought that it was Jesus.

What do you think about the star? Was it real or was it just a scientific event? I am no believer of mythology myself but I guess time will tell. Whatever may be the origin or cause of this event, it has certainly made an interesting tale.

I would like to end on that note, but don't forget to keep wondering.
