This project has helped the students to have better spatial awareness and learn critical thinking skills and increased their cultural awareness.






CHRONICLE WRITING



The competition along with being engaging also proved to be highly enlightening for the participating students. They learnt about the personalities which widened their horizons about events of the past.


The students performed to their full potential and brought out their creative element with drawings, creativity, art and writing styles.






