Summer Fields School, Kailash Colony, successfully hosted Chaturanga – The Interschool Rapid Chess Championship 2025 on 24th and 25th July, in collaboration with Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. The event brought together over 400 participants from 42 renowned schools across Delhi and NCR in a celebration of strategy, intellect, and sportsmanship.

The event was graced by Chief Guest Mr. Adhiban Baskaran, Chess Grandmaster and Olympiad gold medalist, and Guest of Honor Mr. Khushmeet Singh, former International hockey player and Senior Manager at Indian Oil. Other dignitaries included Chairman Shri Inder Dev Gupta, Principal, Ms. Shalini Agarwal, Ms. Neera Kanojia (Head of Cambridge), and Academic Advisor Mr. Ashok Arora.

The ceremony began with the lighting of the ceremonial lamp and a vibrant **cultural performance** by students. The Principal, Ms. Shalini Agarwal welcomed the guests and emphasized chess as a builder of patience, strategic thinking, and life skills. The Chief Guest encouraged players to compete with passion and integrity.

The tournament, held under FIDE regulations in a Swiss-system format over five rounds, was officiated by Chief Arbiter IA Amit Sharma and divided into three categories: Classes III–V, VI–VIII, and IX–XII.



Winners were awarded **trophies**, **medals**, **certificates**, **and cash prizes** at the prize distribution ceremony. The event concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks to all who contributed to its success.

More than a competition, **Chaturanga 2025** was a celebration of intellect, discipline, and community-honoring the timeless legacy of chess.








Learning Beyond Books


being. The assembly was informative and inspiring, leaving everyone with the strong message that true wealth lies in good health.

Summer Fields Band Rocks the Stage at Rang Bahaar 2025








SCHOLAR BADGE CEREMONY








Decoding the CS Profession: A Step Towards Strategic Careers Workshop for Classes XI & XII








Law and Legal Careers Workshop for Classes XI & XII






















COMPUTER SCIENCE DAY














Between Blocks and Becoming
