STRENGTHENING ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION PRACTICES

On the 8th & 9th of September, 2025 Summer Fields School, Greater Kailash -1, conducted a CBSE Workshop on the topic "Strengthening Assessment and Evaluation Practices" for teachers. A span of two days was dedicated to the illuminating workshop where the primary objective was to enhance the understanding and implementation of effective assessment and evaluation strategies among the teaching faculty in alignment with CBSE guidelines and the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The session aimed to equip teachers with practical tools and techniques to ensure assessments are more meaningful, student-centric, and outcome-based.

The topic was introduced by highlighting the importance of formative and summative assessments and how evaluation practices have evolved over the years. The Key areas were addressed with a smooth and consistent flow, focusing on the understanding the objectives of assessment in the 21st-century classroom, shifting from rote-based learning to competency-based evaluation, aligning assessments with learning outcomes, designing assessment tools that cater to various learning styles, using assessment data for remedial and enrichment purposes. An overview of the latest CBSE circulars and assessment frameworks was also provided.

Teachers participated in group activities to design question papers and rubrics for both scholastic and co-scholastic areas. Sample assessments were analyzed to understand their alignment with learning objectives and Bloom's Taxonomy.
